



Line-Installation Permission Agreement

Farmers Mutual Telephone Company (Farmers) and Lac qui Parle County have been awarded a Recovery Act Grant and Loan package to build a fiber-to-the-premise network in Lac qui Parle County. A reputable communications contractor will be obtained to build out the new telecommunications system. While the contractor constructs new lines in the right-of-ways, it is considerably more cost effective for you, the potential customer, and Farmers, to allow the contractor to lay a line to your home at the same time.

While the contractor is in the process of working in the right of ways, **Farmers will bury the line to your home at no obligation or cost to you**, the property owner. The construction of the new line to the home or business **does not require** or obligate the property owner to change communication services from the existing provider(s) to Farmers Mutual Telephone.

Therefore, Farmers is requesting your permission to bury a line across your property as part of its construction project to build a new advanced communications system in the rural Lac qui Parle County area. This will allow you, in the future, to have a choice for telephone, high speed data, Internet, and cable television providers.
